Spring Recommissioning of your British classic car

1. Check and Top Up:

- Engine Oil
- Gearbox and Differential Oil
- Brake and Clutch Fluids
- Cars with hydraulic systems may leak fluid over the cold winter months (while in storage) so check those levels
- Condition of coolant hoses, rad cap
- Coolant Level
- Carb Dampers (SU / Stromberg) light oil or ATF
- Battery Electrolyte charge battery, if necessary
- Check Drivebelts and HT leads

2. Lubricate

- Chassis
- Grease Points
- Hinges
- Seat sliders, especially if different drivers
- etc.

3. Check Brakes

- Check brake pedal feel
- Handbrake operation
- Ensure handbrakes release okay

4. Wheels

- Check wheel bearings
- Check suspension joints
- Check and adjust tire pressures, including spare wheel
- Check jack and wheel wrench
- Check security of wheel nuts / knock offs

5. General Checks

- Perform thorough visual check for rodent damage
- Ensure accelerator linkage is free
- Refit battery, ensuring connections are clean and secure
 - Observe polarity, fitting ground side last
- Fuses, ensure connections are clean and secure
- Operation of warning lights and gauges
- All lights side lights, headlamps, stop and turn signals
- Wipers, washers, horn, etc.
- Fire Extinguisher

6. Further Checks

- Start and Warm up car
 - Monitor oil pressure, coolant temperature, etc.
 - Battery charging okay
 - Check for oil / coolant / exhaust leaks
 - Check electric cooling fan working okay
- Go for Road Test
 - Drive carefully
 - Check for unusual noises / vibrations
 - Take cell phone with CAA on speed dial

Final Steps

- Check all Paperwork is up-to-date
 - License plates
 - Insurance
 - Is an Appraisal required
 - CAA membership
 - Car club membership
- Clean
- Polish
- Fill gas tank
- Make sure CAA phone number is on cell phone's speed dial
- Enjoy carefree summer motoring
